- <sup>1</sup> O LORD, remember in David's favor all the hard-**ships he en**-dured;  
<sup>2</sup> how he swore to the LORD and vowed to the Migh-**ty One of** Jacob,  
<sup>3</sup> "I will not enter my house or get **in-to my** bed;  
<sup>4</sup> I will not give sleep to my eyes or slum-**ber to my** eyelids,  
<sup>5</sup> until I find a place for **the** LORD,  
a dwelling place for the Migh-**ty One of** Jacob." R
- <sup>6</sup> We heard of it in Ephrathah; we found it in **the fields of** Jaar.  
<sup>7</sup> "Let us go to his dwelling place; let us wor-**ship at his** footstool."  
<sup>8</sup> Rise up, O LORD, and go to your resting place, you and the ark of **your** might.  
<sup>9</sup> Let your priests be clothed with righteousness, and let your faith-**ful shout for** joy.  
<sup>10</sup> For your ser-**vant Da-vid's** sake  
do not turn away the face **of your an**-ointed one. R
- <sup>11</sup> The LORD swore to David a sure oath from which he **will not turn** back:  
"One of the sons of your body I will **set on your** throne.  
<sup>12</sup> If your sons keep my covenant and my decrees **that I shall** teach them,  
their sons also, forevermore, shall **sit on your** throne." R
